
LAUNDRY: THE FUN KIND!








(Continued from page 2, Building & Grounds) The original part of the building is no longer tied to the County and has not been for quite some time. Any repairs, updates and the insurance on the property, is an expense of the senior center. Just as any older building, it often has repairs. We budget for repairs, but you can't predict them all. Currently, our projects are smaller than the new roofing system implemented on the "old" part of the building in 2019 to remedy a leaky flat roof, and the parking lot project completed last year. Recently, we added an emergency exit on the backside of the parking lot because our entrance and exit are both on Muntz Street, and if blocked by emergency personnel, membership would be stuck in the lot. The new gate allows an alternative exit in the event of an emergency.

The handrails in our parking lot were replaced after being run over in a "hit and run" for the second time in three years. The Hillsboro City Police did an excellent job with the investigation of the destruction of our property, but unfortunately, were not able to find the vandals. We also fixed a leak in the roof of the "new" part of the building. A new metal roof was added in 2013, but the warranty has expired. After years of unknown subtle water damage, the original pole on the outside of our entrance needed to

be replaced. It started to fail and allowed the brick on top of the building to crack from the stress of weight. Five different places in the floor will be replaced due to left over concrete from Kroger that has started to crack our tile. Below are some pictures of the repairs and updates. Look for more repairs and improvements in 2024; hopefully, they're all planned.
